Feelings and Physics

Often, our initial reaction to something, whether negative or positive, occurs because of our immediate feeling at the moment it happened. We may have felt good or bad, happy or sad, angry or frightened, surprised or disappointed, or a myriad of other sudden and usually fleeting emotions. Feelings are a part of our Adam-like nature and can impel us to take action. They can also act as a protective device warning us when we should flee a situation.

However, when we take an action which is based only on our feelings, we can misjudge the situation and make mistakes. Emotion can cause us to act without knowing all the facts. We have therefore allowed the emotion of the moment to prevail. Some examples of these reactions are when a corrupt politician or unethical salesman inspires others through artful rhetoric, when a cruel word of gossip becomes so impelling that we repeat it, or when we well up with anger about something we may have taken out of context.

While "feelings" are the first line of defense offered by the Adam-like nature, they are not that which we can fully trust. This is why scripture teaches us to be "discerning" and explains that "feelings" may be misleading and are often used by Satan to our detriment. While feelings can provide us with that split second moment when we must take action it is always best to consider whether or not what we want to do is what we should do. Discerning allows us to compare our Adam-like response to the Christ-like response.



We must use our Christ-like nature to be an "overcomer". Overcoming or controlling our Adam-like nature is in essence controlling our immediate emotions. This is pleasing to God and protects us from the wiles of Satan.

But what so few of us understand is that the science of physics teaches us that our universe is a "balanced" one and that one part is dependent upon another. Physics teaches us that a certain harmony or balance must exist between the elements so that one does not overpower another.

While a scientist may not agree that the word "physics" is applicable to words such as Yin and Yang, black and white, good and evil, hope and despair, life and death they might agree that they do indicate a kind of gravitational pull between opposites and therefore a struggle for power. Thus it is not unrealistic to believe that the spiritual warfare between good and evil under which we labor is also a struggle for power and employs the need for a specific set of rules, a specific set of occurrences to achieve its goal.

It helps us immensely when we understand that as children of God we are moving through a plan which our Heavenly Father has instituted to separate good and evil for all eternity and that by doing so we will have the opportunity to live for all eternity in a world without evil. To achieve spiritual success on a personal level requires that we overcome evil by following the rules set forth by scripture which will allow us to shed evil by replacing it with good. Love can overcome hate.

God's plan is to create a new heaven and earth which will contain no evil at all.... none... in its confines. Thus the interaction which exists between Yin and Yang, good and evil, hope and despair, life and death, hot or cold, and black and white will end and a new world, a new "physics" will be created which achieves its balance through good; love and hope, loyalty and honor, integrity and truth, and by perfect righteousness. This will be the environment of the new physics of our future home.

Our Heavenly Father wants to ban all evil and we must accept the fact that we CANNOT enter His new world without shedding evil. Perhaps believing that this is the "physics" of the new creation, not an arbitrary "rule" which God made and can therefore break, helps us understand what scripture tells us about God working under the rules of His own righteousness. He cannot do otherwise because He ordained that it not be otherwise.

Thus those who will be surprised that God's compassion did not cover them and allow them entry into the new Heaven and Earth have perhaps not understood that God wants, with all His heart that ALL men be saved, BUT that under the rules of the "physics" of righteousness.....He has also ordained that He must follow the rules He created for the good of all. Therefore we must dally...gratefully.... and humbly..... seek the forgiveness God so lovingly offers us.

Luke 21:36 tells us "Watch ye therefore, and pray always that ye may be accounted worthy to escape these things that shall come to pass." This clearly tells us that God has warned us about what we can expect to occur in our future. He also tells us why we must be prepared to live through those times and provides through scripture how we are to do so. God explains what "armor" He provides to help us and what mind set we must develop to endure. However dim this may sound, God also explains what the reward will be if we can endure and can remain faithful.

God clearly explains in Matthew 24:21 how difficult it will be saying "For then shall be a great tribulation such as was not since the beginning of the world, to this time, nor ever shall be." This is a dire warning but despite what will occur, God will provide for those who will become the Bride of Christ and help them endure these circumstances.
