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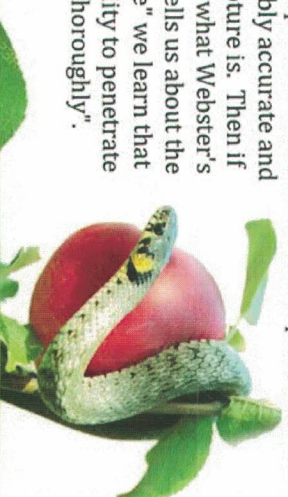


The First and Last Lie

As the story of the Creation unfolds and we read about the relationship which Adam and Eve had with God, we learn that God asked only that they respect and honor His request not to eat the fruit from one of the many trees in the Garden of Eden. As they walked in the Garden which God had created for them and they freely conversed with God, they were happy and as we learn from Genesis 2:25: "And they were both naked, the man and his wife, and were not ashamed."

This verse tells us that at that point in time both Adam and Eve had absolutely nothing to hide... from God or from one another. They were free of sin, free of deceit, free of guile, and of anything which could cause them to be embarrassed or ashamed. They carried no guilt, felt no pain, endured no suffering, and had no dishonor in them. But following this verse, we are immediately introduced to the incredible subtlety of the serpent who wanted to take all this away from them. The very first words in this verse which describes this event tells us: "Now the serpent was more subtle than any beast....." (Genesis 3:1)

The true miracle of scripture is that God will always open our understanding when we seek to learn. Thus when we study how God wove the beginning of His plan of salvation up to the culmination of that plan, we learn how incredibly accurate and perfect scripture is. Then if we examine what Webster's Dictionary tells us about the word "subtle" we learn that it is "the ability to penetrate deeply and thoroughly".



It also means "cunningly contrived", "highly skillful" and "operating insidiously". Armed with this definition and then reading further in that verse, we see that the serpent then posed a question to Adam and Eve: "Ye shall not eat of every tree in the garden?"

If we take a close look at those words we can understand why they became the first lie; the first lying innuendo known to man. Those words implied, simply by asking a question, that Eve must have misunderstood God's instructions; that surely God could not have meant that they should be deprived of such a benefit. The question implied that surely God had made the entire Garden of Eden for their benefit so why would God then deny them such a small part of it?

In many parts of scripture we are taught that God never changes; that He is the same today as He was yesterday; that His laws and statutes do not change; that only grace has brought the change mankind required to become a part of the community of God. Therefore as we move ahead to examine the last lie in Biblical history we can see how very similar it is to the first lie. We can see that the first lie affected not only one couple but everyone born thereafter and as we study further we will see that the last lie touches everyone in the world as well. What we learn from this is that Satan's tactics to separate man from God has never changed either, but that man's fallibility...when he does not know God's words.....has greatly increased.

The last lie and the one which will cause many children of God to fall away from their faith and lose their soul salvation is today's application of political correctness. This last lie is fathered by the same deceiver who fathered the first lie....the serpent, Satan. Political correctness is a satanic scourge which puts forth to all of mankind the same question that it put to Eve. What is really says is: "Why can you not have all that you want?" Satan frames his question as a challenge to man: "Surely you can bend God's words to be more loving and compassionate!" What this makes man believe is that he must bend God's words

to become the compassionate, forgiving, understanding soul God wants.

And thus is born the entrapment of good people all over the world through their ego which impels them to want to be seen as "good" people... but in the eyes of the world.... rather than in the eyes of God. It is the lack of understanding and lack of trust in God's statutes which has allowed this lie to become so believable. It has spawned dishonesty by implying that this serves the greater good. It is deceit to imply that we must not anger anyone with the truth. It has spawned sinful behavior with the assumption that one cannot change. And it has desecrated the sacrament of Holy Communion by allowing it to be taken unworthily by condoning sin under the guise of not judging.

Sadly many of these politically correct arguments appear kind and compassionate and cause confusion in the children of God. We no longer know right from wrong and no longer have the backbone to stand up for what God tells us in scripture. In the quest to show compassion and try not to judge, sin and bad behavior is excused, even condoned. It is justified by the Adam-like nature of those who commit those sins and those who, to feel good about themselves, allow them. But it is an artificial "goodness" which is created around those who excuse ungodly behavior and it fills churches with those who want no constraints on their interaction with others or what Holy Communion actually demands of every individual.

Further, political correctness has determined that the "rules" laid down by scripture are "old fashioned" and "not fit for the times in which we live". This occurs despite the fact that God and His Statutes are the same today as they were yesterday and that not one word of scripture is to be changed. In the fourth verse of Genesis 3, we read that the serpent said to Eve: "Ye shall not surely die". Here we can see that this lie, offered so long ago by the serpent is the same lie Satan perpetuates today. If Satan said instead: "Go ahead and sin with abandon and still ye shall not die as God says because He forgives everything anyway", perhaps we would think twice about our actions.

In verse 5 of Genesis 3 we read: "For God doth know....your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil." Amazingly, this is exactly what political correctness tells us. That now, as we have matured as a country and a people, we finally understand compassion and forgiveness. Therefore the premise now being taught is that God wants us to look the other way in the face of sin, do whatever makes us happy or whatever we can justify, and never rebuke, chastise or teach what scripture tells us. It also supports the idea that all sin is forgiven even when we have no remorse for those sins.

The truth however, is that to have our sins forgiven we must acknowledge that what we did was a sin, we must have remorse for having committed that sin, and we must wish, hope and work toward not committing that sin again. We also have to forgive others who remain in their sins. The truth is that God's admonitions, not man's determinations, teach what is sin both yesterday and today, and that while God will forgive our sin, certain conditions exist for us to obtain and retain that privilege.

In Genesis 3:8 we read that because of their disobedience Adam and Eve then hid from the Lord. This marks the first human form of deceit. That action dishonored God and their relationship with Him. It spawned the first "blame game" where Adam blamed his sin and deceit on Eve. It led to the first enmity to emerge between two people. It created the patterns in which all of mankind could so easily become trapped. God does not require that we reach perfection here on earth, but does require that we are free of sin when we enter His new kingdom. The sacrifice Christ made for us is eternal and freely given. We are asked to show our appreciation of that gift through the worthy application of Holy Communion. To help us understand the incredible power of that gift we are taught the pre-requisites which show God our sincerity.

While 144,000 might be a symbolic number which scripture provides for those who will be a part of the Bride of Christ, comparatively and percentage-wise, this number clearly warns us that few souls will meet the criteria God has set for His Holy Family. Yes, there will still be the lambs for Heaven, but do we really want to begin and end our life of faith not understanding what changes we need to make to become one of those
