This advises us to learn God's words and be willing to live by them no matter how inconvenient or politically incorrect it is to do so. We are asked to stand firm in protecting our faith and in supporting what God has asked of us.

Scripture also teaches us about those things which Satan will use to break our faith and to draw us away from being a part of the bride of Christ. Satan wants us to become one of the five foolish virgins rather than one of the five wise. (Matthew 25:1-13) Therefore, we must view every story in scripture as God's way to help us understand His plan of salvation, understand Satan's role in our life, and what the righteousness under which God chooses to govern means to us as individuals.

One of these wonderful stories is when Christ went out into the Mount of Olives just before He was to be captured and crucified and spoke to His apostles. To Peter He said "Verrily I say unto thee, that this night, before the cock crows, thou shalt deny me thrice". (Matthew 26:30) Peter of course was offended and told Christ that he would never deny him, even if it meant his death. (Matthew 26:35)

Christ, knowing what was to befall Peter and also knowing that both Peter and the rest of His disciples, would deny Him, was "exceedingly sorrowful". (Matthew 26:38) At the Mount of Olives, Christ asked His disciples to sit with him, and to pray with Him and watch with Him, but they did not. Instead they "fell asleep". This created a sorrow in Christ's heart needing so much to have their love and companionship at this crossroads in His life.

Christ had earlier explained to His disciples that the power given Him by His Father in Heaven was so great that He could easily call upon His Father to give Him everything He would need to win against

the evil which came His way. He tried to make His disciples understand that the scriptures needed to be fulfilled and thus the situation which Christ now found Himself needed to occur. (Matthew 26:53-54)

Peter never thought that he would deny Christ. Peter felt that he was faithful and would always, without fail believe, support and build the work of Christ. But Peter was frightened that night on the Mount of Olives when he was asked if He knew Christ. He was afraid to admit to being His follower; afraid of what the authorities would do to him, so he denied knowing Christ when asked. (Matthew 26:70) In fact, Peter denied Christ three times that night and on that third occasion the cock crowed and Peter's heart trembled as he remembered what Christ had predicted. He was so ashamed that he wept bitterly. (Matthew 26:71-75)

There is an important lesson for each of us in this story. It is to recognize that right now, today, even though we have been asked to remain faithful to God in all things, many of us are denying Christ and even reveling in doing so. Many are foolishly accepting what is politically correct yet diametrically opposed to Biblical principles. When we vote for leaders who we know will pass laws allowing murder, banning Christian practices, subverting the sacrament of marriage, supporting the annihilation of an entire nation, banning the word "God" and prayer in public places.....we are denying and betraying Christ.

Judas understood the gravity of what he had done after he had betrayed Christ. He realized that he'd sinned and had followed his own thoughts rather than trusted Christ. Judas was unable to benefit from what he'd received for his betrayal and soon recognized that what he'd done was a sin. His remorse was not enough and pained him so much

that he hung himself. (Matthew 27:4, 5)

Judas is an example of what will become of us if, during these end times, we deny Christ by denying those statutes by which God and Christ asks us to live and to protect. It is not enough to excuse our behavior in the name of "the better good" because this "better good" was exactly why Judas did what he did. Nor can we claim a personal weakness because Christ died for our sins and promises to help us be an overcomer of those sins.

Judas fully believed that having Christ arrested would force Christ to declare Himself King and show the world that He was the Son of God. Judas acted on his own thoughts and the opinion he formed of what he deemed was the "better good" and therefore did not bow to the will of God. Sadly many of us act in this manner today when we embrace activities and policies which deny what God teaches through scripture.

Scripture clearly tells us that Satan can blind the hearts and minds of men and lead us to false conclusions. (2 Corinthians 4:4) Only by adhering to what God tells us can we be assured that we are on the right path. Only by comparing all thoughts and actions to what the Bible tells us can we be assured that we will find favor in the sight of God. Thus when we assume that we know better than what scripture tells us or that God is surely understanding of certain situations He deems as sin in scripture, we may be robbed of our soul salvation.

Scripture tells us to rebuke, admonish, exhort, and teach the Biblical principles of God's word. (2 Timothy 4:2, 1 Thessalonians 5:14) It also tells us not to lean to our own understanding (Proverbs 3:5-6), but to stay on the path of righteousness. Thus we must be very careful not to defend political correctness and its support of those things which scripture tells us is not in accordance with Biblical
